EYFS Area: Communication and Language

Learning Goal: Listening and attention

Did you know?

Practising concentration by following instructions will help your child progress through school.

How to play

- 1. **Introduce** the shapes to your child one by one and check they know the shape names. Cut the shapes from scrap paper.
- 2. Lay them out on the floor. Explain that these are your 'stones' and the floor is the 'river'.
- 3. **Explain** to your child that they need to get from one end of the room to the other using the stones, and without stepping on the floor otherwise they have to go back to the beginning!
- 4. Praise your child when they reach the other side this is a tricky game!

TIP: Ask your child to repeat your instructions before they play. This is a good way of checking their comprehension.

Level 2

When your child has mastered staying on the 'stones' to cross the river, try introducing **different rules**. For example, 'only step on the triangles' or 'only step on squares'.

Level 3

When your child can obey simple rules to cross the 'river', **colour** the pieces of paper in using pens, pencils or paints and add **extra rules**. For example, 'you can only step on red triangles and squares to cross'.

Top tip

Once your child has the hang of it, you can add a new challenge, e.g. only stepping on the squares and circles.
